Vision

Franklin County School District is committed to helping students develop the skills necessary to manage their emotions and behaviors by developing self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision-making. We support students' socio-emotional development, both within and outside of the classroom, by partnering with families and communities to provide these skills in a culturally responsive manner.

Why is addressing SEL important in an MTSS?

MTSS is a school improvement framework that allows our schools to effectively organize support for all students in order to maximize success. Research has demonstrated skills acquired during SEL are as teachable as academic standards and behavioral expectations. Students' social-emotional skills can be shaped well into adolescence; therefore, having a continuum of support from pre-kindergarten through high school is a pillar of the model. SEL is defined around five basic competencies which encompass "soft skills" that will assist students across settings and throughout their lifespan. SEL goes beyond teaching discrete desired behaviors within school settings; it is a process of acquiring a myriad of skills and an understanding of how and when to use them.
