Superintendent's Report June 9, 2025

Blueprint Goal 1: Preparing FCS Students for College, Career and Life Beyond the Classroom

CTE Career Camps will be held June 16th-June 19th and June 23rd-June 26th. Mural Makers Academy Art Camp will be held June 23rd-June 26th. Camp hours are 9 am-2 pm and will be held at each of the traditional high schools. Students in grades rising 6-rising 8 were invited to register. There were 129 registrations completed with some students planning to attend camp both weeks. Students attending CTE Career Camps have the opportunity to learn about the following program areas: Automotive, Business and Marketing, Carpentry, Family and Consumer Sciences, and Health Science.

District C Summer Teamship will be held July 7th-July 10th from 9 am-5 pm at Louisburg College. Students in grades rising 8-rising 12 were invited to register and there were 60 registrations completed. Students participating in the teamship will have an opportunity to work as a team to solve a real problem for a business. At the conclusion of camp, teams will present their solution to the business during the pitch event.

Blueprint Goal 2: Achieving Student Success in Academic Areas

On Wednesday, June 18, school administrators and district staff will meet at Bunn High School for *Sun, Sand, and School Plans: Building a Brighter 2025-2026*. This meeting will be an opportunity to review instructional practices and outcomes for the 2024-2025 school year, collaborate with colleagues, and set preliminary goals based on our new strategic plan.

Over the last few days, students and schools alike have been hard at work administering and completing all End of Year assessments. Students in Grades 3-8 have completed EOG testing in ELA, Math, and 5th & 8th Grade Science. In High School, students in select courses have completed EOC's. All schools are and will be providing retest opportunities to eligible students through the end of this week.

Blueprint Goal 3: Creating a Safe, Orderly and Caring Environment for Students

Franklin County Schools Operations is preparing a draft of a reduced capital budget in response to the County Manager's proposed \$2,000,000 capital local budget. This draft will be provided to the Board of Education next week and reviewed in detail during the facilities work session on June 30. The goal is to finalize and approve the recommended budget during the special called meeting scheduled for later that same day, June 30, 2025.

Blueprint Goal 4: Recruiting, Supporting, and Retaining High-Quality Staff



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As part of our work to support and retain high-quality educators, we recently celebrated the accomplishments of our beginning teachers. This year's BT3 Graduation was held at Louisburg Magnet High School on Wednesday, May 28th, and recognized 47 beginning teachers who completed all NC Beginning Teacher Support Program requirements.

On Friday, June 6th, we hosted The Frankies, our district awards ceremony. This event was held at Franklinton High School and honored the achievements of district staff in several categories, including retirees, Beginning Teacher of the Year, Teacher of the Year, Classified Employee of the Year, Volunteer of the Year, Exceptional Children Educator of the Year, Career and Technical Education Teacher of the Year, Assistant Principal of the Year, Principal of the Year, Auxiliary Services Award, Dianne Massey-Carter Award, Outstanding Math Teacher Award, SRO of the Year, and the Diane Marks Excellence in Service Award.
